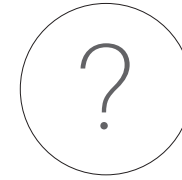

WHY WE BELIEVE IT

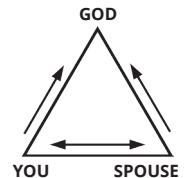
We fail to understand relationships are spiritual in nature. Because of this spiritual essence, our relationships with God and with our spouse are interconnected and dependent on each other.
