Understanding Initial Needs

Definition: *Need*—a necessary thing or a thing that is required

About these needs:

- You have vowed a sacred vow to meet them.
- You have vowed not to have them met by someone else.
- Your spouse deserves them from you.
- You deserve them from your spouse.
- Without them, your marriage will suffer.

Understanding the initial needs of a wife:

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;" (Ephesians 5:25)

"So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself" (Ephesians 5:28)

"Husbands, love your wives, and be not bitter against them." (Colossians 3:19)

"Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered." (1 Peter 3:7)

Understanding Indispensable Needs

A woman's indispensable need is love—expressed as relational and emotional nurture.

A man's indispensable need is reverence—expressed in physical intimacy.

Principles about indispensable needs:

- They are different between a husband and wife.
- Your goal should be to abundantly meet this need.
- Your focus should be on your spouse, not yourself.
- Your spouse must teach you how to meet this need.
- You must be teachable and seek to understand.
- These needs are exclusive to your marital vow.
- These needs recur frequently in your spouse's heart.
- These needs are equal opposites.
- They feed each other in a cycle of selfless giving.
- They can defeat each other in a cycle of withholding.

There is a predictable process of break-down when a marriage literally becomes incompatible.

- Step 1 - One spouse fails to meet the need of the other for a season of time.
- Step 2 - The neglected spouse feels the loss with increasing intensity.
- Step 3 - The neglected spouse, either consciously or unconsciously, withdraws.

- Step 4 - The other spouse intensifies the withdrawal—now we have mutual offense!
- Step 5 - Both spouses have a relational “stranglehold” on the marriage relationship.
- Step 6 - A stand off ensues in which both spouses suffer until someone gives in.
- Step 7 - When no one gives in, the marriage grows colder and more distant by the day.
- Step 8 - Satan tempts each spouse to look elsewhere for their “oxygen.”
- Step 9 - Both spouses become more angry and bitter at each other by the day.
- Step 10 - Either someone gives in and repents, or the marriage self-destructs.

What to do when your marriage meets incompatibility:

“Now concerning the things whereof ye wrote unto me: It is good for a man not to touch a woman. Nevertheless, to avoid fornication, let every man have his own wife, and let every woman have her own husband. Let the husband render unto the wife due benevolence: and likewise also the wife unto the husband. The wife hath not power of her own body, but the husband: and likewise also the husband hath not power of his own body, but the wife. Defraud ye not one the other, except it be with consent for a time, that ye may give yourselves to fasting and prayer; and come together again, that Satan tempt you not for your incontinency. (1 Corinthians 7:1-15)
