A. We must avoid children to wrath

Fathers, provoke not your children to anger, lest they be discouraged. COLOSSIANS 3:21

i. We must not expect more of them than they are capable of giving or doing

For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith. ROMANS 12:3

ii. We need to be careful about the way we correct our children

A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger. PROVERBS 15:1

iii. We must practice what we preach

Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you. PHILIPPIANS 4:9

iv. We ought to fill the minds of our children with proper values and standards by principle and personal example

But the Lord said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart. 1 SAMUEL 16:7

v. We should seek to have fun with our children

A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ECCLESIASTES 3:4

A merry heart doeth good like a medicine: but a broken spirit drieth the bones. PROVERBS 17:22

vi. We should freely communicate love and appreciation to our children

A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another. JOHN 13:34-35

vii. We need to allow them to fail

And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins. 1 PETER 4:8

viii. We should make our expectations, rules, and regulations known to our children

Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it. PROVERBS 22:6

ix. We need to admit when we are wrong

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. JAMES 5:16

x. We need to make it easy for them to come to us about anything

Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: JAMES 1:19

B. We must bring them up in the of the Lord

This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success. JOSHUA 1:8

C. We must bring them up in the _ of the Lord

i. Clear boundaries and limits need to be set

The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame. PROVERBS 29:15

ii. Avoid the danger of unannounced rules

iii. Make sure the children understand your rules and regulations

iv. Do not give your children too many rules

v. Avoid making hard and fast rules about trivial things

vi. Do not make rules that your children cannot keep

vii. Beware of constantly moving the boundaries or changing the rules and regulations

viii. Do not fall into the practice of making arbitrary rules

Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right. Honour thy father and mother; (which is the first commandment with promise;) EPHESIANS 6:1-2

ix. Seek to establish your rules and regulations on biblical principles

x. Remember that rules and regulations are for the good of your children

xi. Do not make rules which you know you cannot enforce

xii. Whenever possible, not only tell them what you expect, but show them

xiii. Impart the idea that you expect immediate obedience

xiv. When the rules are broken, administer the necessary correction
